

Do Your Fire Boots Need To Be Replaced?

Damaged or soiled boots can be unsafe and non-compliant. NFPA 1851 mandates that boots be replaced 10 years from date of manufacture but many other variables come into play.

Use this guide to gauge if it's time for new boots.

Replace Boots

10+

Boots manufacture date older than 10 years



Boots no longer water resistant after 3-hour bucket submersion test



Boots exposed to CBRN terrorism agent



Boots no longer cleanable after last structure fire



Boots have broken or missing stitching or seam tape



Boots liner system discolored or shows significant changes in texture


Have Boots Inspected To Determine Repair or Replacement



Boots show minor evidence of contamination



Boots have some stitching or seam tape issues



Boots liner system shows minor discoloration or texture changes

None of the Above Issues Apply?

Your boots likely meet all NFPA standards. Remember to complete regular inspections in accordance with NFPA 1851 guidelines to help ensure your safety.
